

# HOW DOES LITERACY AFFECT CHILDHOOD DEVELOPMENT?

46%

of parents say they read aloud every day with their children, and only 34% read for at least

15 minutes

of children start kindergarten lacking the basic language skills they will need in order to

learn to read

Children under 5 with limited home reading exposure are deprived of opportunity for brain

activation

In lowincome neighborhoods, only 1 book is available for every 300 children

90% of a child's brain develops BEFORE AGE FIVE, emphasizing the importance of early intervention.

Obesity, academic failure, substance abuse, teen pregnancy & juvenile delinquency have been linked to a child's literacy level & correlated with **INADEQUATE EARLY EXPOSURE** TO BOOKS

These poor health outcomes **FUEL CYCLES OF POVERTY.** stymieing countless children while costing hundreds of billions of dollars a year in the United States.

SOLUTION

96% of children under 5 see their doctor at least once a year.

Parents who participate in our program are up to 4 times more likely to read to their young children, & their children enter kindergarten with larger vocabularies & stronger language skills.



MEDICAL PROVIDERS HAVE EARLY **ACCESS TO FAMILIES & ARE A** TRUSTED SOURCE OF HEALTH INFORMATION.

Children who are read to during infancy & preschool years have **BETTER LANGUAGE SKILLS** when they start school & are more interested in reading.





#### STATEMENT I prescribe books because I want to give parents a tool to accomplish

some of the most valuable guidance that I share at each of the regularly scheduled well child check-ups during the critically important first five years of a child's life. Many parents are unaware of the importance of early and routine book sharing. Many also lack ready access to high quality books. The books provided by Reach Out and Read Colorado are of the highest quality, and are also culturally and developmentally appropriate.

Besides helping contribute to increases in preschool language scores, I see book sharing as a way to help buffer children from the detrimental impact of the stress that is inherent to living in poverty and by promoting bonding and warmth between a parent and their child. In addition, as I routinely espouse, giving a book and accompanying guidance are a reflection of my faith in every parent's desire and ability to help his or her child reach their maximum potential.
